AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING A SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATION IN THE AMOUNT OF \$38,645.00 FROM UNAPPROPRIATED FUND BALANCE AND UNBUDGETED REVENUE FOR THE NORTHEAST TIF REDEVELOPMENT PROJECT FUND

WHEREAS, the City of Springfield is a home rule unit as defined in Article VII, Section 6(a) of the 1970 Illinois Constitution and has jurisdiction over matters pertaining to its government and affairs; and

WHEREAS, the City has adopted a program for the Redevelopment Project Area known as The Northeast TIF Redevelopment Project Area (Dirksen Marketplace Project), in the City of Springfield, pursuant to "The Tax Increment Allocation Redevelopment Act, as amended," 65 ILCS 5/11-74.4-1, et seq. (hereinafter referred to as the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the provisions of the Act, the City has adopted a Tax Increment Redevelopment Plan and Project (hereinafter referred to as the "Plan") pertaining to the redevelopment of the Northeast TIF Redevelopment Area, a copy of which plan is on file with the City Clerk of the City of Springfield. Pursuant to Ordinance No. 703-12-03 adopted by the Corporate Authorities on December 2, 2003, the City approved the Tax Increment Redevelopment Plan and Project for the Northeast TIF Redevelopment Project Area (the "Redevelopment Plan"); and

WHEREAS, by ordinance 374-06-05 adopted by the Corporate Authorities on June 7, 2005, the City approved the issuance of Taxable Tax Increment Revenue Bonds, Series 2005, in the amount of \$2,438,000; and

WHEREAS, Section 7(c) specifies that 50% of funds remaining in the TIF Special Allocation Fund after paying required debt service amounts, shall be considered statutory surplus for distribution to the various taxing bodies 50% surplus for eligible project costs; and

WHEREAS, reimbursement for fiscal year 2015 surplus related to the Northeast TIF Redevelopment area will be approximately \$181,255.00; and

WHEREAS, the fiscal year 2015 appropriation is insufficient to cover the surplus payments so a supplemental appropriation is needed.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SPRINGFIELD, ILLINOIS:

<u>Section 1</u>: That the City Council authorizes a supplemental appropriation from unappropriated fund balance and unbudgeted revenue in the amount of \$38,645 for the Office of Budget and Management to cover reimbursement project costs related to the Northeast TIF.

<u>Section 2</u>: That the Office of Budget and Management is hereby authorized to effectuate this supplemental appropriation by depositing \$38,645 of unappropriated, unbudgeted fund balance into expenditure account 048-107-BMGT-ACCT-2110.

A RESOLUTION ALLOCATING 2015 BOND VOLUME CAP

WHEREAS, the City of Springfield is a home rule unit as defined in Article VII, Section 6(a) of the 1970 Illinois Constitution and has jurisdiction over matters pertaining to its government and affairs; and

WHEREAS, there exists within the borders of the City a recognized need for lower cost financing of business expansion to create and retain jobs; and

WHEREAS, there exists within the borders of the City a recognized need for lower cost financing of single family home ownership to provide decent, safe and secure housing for persons on all income levels; and

WHEREAS, the City is authorized under state law and the City's home rule powers (1) to issue Revenue Bonds to finance below market interest rate loans to manufacturing facilities to encourage the creation and retention of jobs; (2) to issue Mortgage Bonds to induce qualified home buyers; and (3) to issue Mortgage Credit Certificates to induce qualified home buyers.

WHEREAS, the Internal Revenue code of 1986, as amended (the "Code") limits the amount of Bonds that may be issued by the City on a tax-exempt basis under the Code; and

WHEREAS, the City desires to consider establishing and implementing 2015 Bond Programs with the allocation of its 2015 Bond Volume Cap as defined in Section 146 of the Code (the "Volume Cap") in the amount of \$11,700,600.00; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Illinois Private Activity Bond Allocation Act (the "Act"), the City's Volume Cap allocation may be ceded to the State of Illinois if it is not used or allocated to specific projects or purposes by May 1, 2015.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SPRINGFIELD, ILLINOIS:

<u>Section 1</u>: Public Purpose. It is hereby found, determined and declared that the purpose of this resolution is to take steps designed to provide below market interest rate loans to businesses and other organizations to create and retain jobs and/or to induce home ownership.

<u>Section 2</u>: The City Council of the City of Springfield, Illinois, hereby authorizes the allocation of the entire amount of the City's Volume Cap for calendar year 2015 to finance one or more Manufacturing Facility Revenue Bond Projects or Qualified Enterprise Zone Facility Projects or Mortgage Bond or Mortgage Credit Certificates or any combination thereof to be approved by the City Council.

Section 3: Approval of Further Actions. From and after the adoption of this resolution, the proper officials, agents and employees of the City are hereby authorized, empowered and directed to do all such acts and things and to execute all such documents as may be necessary to carry out and comply with the provisions of this resolution or to effectuate the purpose hereof.

This is a standard ordinance for ethernet service from the City's fiber optic telecommunications system.

This ordinance authorizes the City to provide telecommunications service to Illinois National Bank ("INB"), in exchange for payment by INB to the City in an estimated amount of \$59,700.00 over 5 years.

The Office of Public Utilities has a fiber optic telecommunications system and has been granted certificates of service authority with the Illinois Commerce Commission to provide facilities-based exchange telecommunications services in Sangamon County and interexchange telecommunications services within Illinois. The City's network has the ability to provide WAN (wide area network) services across the system. This allows computers to pass data between remote facilities at speeds that are as fast as in the local buildings. This technology allows for consolidation of computers, servers and the required network equipment along with enhancing the capabilities of the facilities.

INB has requested a 100 Mbps connection from their facility at 431 S. 4th Street to 2433 West White Oaks Drive. For this service, INB will pay \$995 per month for the two sites for the term of the contract over a 5 year period. The connection will be done by utilizing existing fiber and communication infrastructure at the two facilities.

INB may elect to terminate this agreement at any time without cause, provided that INB shall thereupon pay the remaining monthly charges for the remainder of the 5 year contract.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 90, SECTION 90.44 OF THE 1988 CITY OF SPRINGFIELD CODE OF ORDINANCES, AS AMENDED, PERTAINING TO WRITTEN EVIDENCE OF AGE AND IDENTITY

WHEREAS, the City of Springfield is a home rule unit as defined in Article VII, Section 6(a) of the 1970 Illinois Constitution and has jurisdiction over matters pertaining to its government and affairs; and

WHEREAS, Chapter 90, Section 90.44 provides for written evidence of age and identity by a licensee of the prospective recipient of any alcoholic liquor; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the City of Springfield to amend Chapter 90, Section 90.44 of the 1988 City of Springfield Code of Ordinances, as amended, to require a motor vehicle operator's license as the only form of written evidence eligible to be provided by a recipient of any alcoholic liquor at a drive-up window of a licensee's establishment.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SPRINGFIELD, ILLINOIS:

Section 1: The City Council of the City of Springfield, Illinois, hereby amends Chapter 90, Section 90.44(a)(1) of the 1988 Springfield City Code of Ordinances, as amended, as follows:

ARTICLE V. MISCELLANEOUS VIOLATIONS AND REQUIREMENTS § 90.44. Determination of age and identity.

- (a) (1) Any person from whom such written evidence is demanded shall display his motor vehicle operator's license, secretary of state's identification card, federal selective service card, federal armed forces identification card, or other written evidence of age and identity issued by a public officer in the performance of his official duties. A licensee shall require any prospective recipient of alcoholic liquor from a drive-up window at the licensee's establishment to display the recipient's motor vehicle operator's license or, if the recipient is a passenger in a motor vehicle, the driver of that motor vehicle to display the driver's motor vehicle operator's license.
 - (2) and (3) (Language shall remain the same)

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 33, SECTION 33.002, AND CHAPTER 36, SECTION 36.05(c) OF THE 1988 CITY OF SPRINGFIELD, CODE OF ORDINANCES, AS AMENDED, PERTAINING TO RESIDENCY REQUIREMENTS FOR APPOINTMENTS TO BOARDS AND COMMISSIONS

WHEREAS, the City of Springfield is a home rule unit as defined in Article VII, Section 6(a) of the 1970 Illinois Constitution and has jurisdiction over matters pertaining to its government and affairs; and

WHEREAS, Chapter 33 of the 1988 City of Springfield Code of Ordinances, as amended, pertains to boards, commissions and subordinate departments within the City of Springfield; and

WHEREAS, Chapter 33, Section 33.002, pertains to appointments to boards, commissions, etc.; and

WHEREAS, Chapter 36, Section 36.05(c), pertains to residency requirements for employees, but unnecessarily includes a provision pertaining to appointments to boards, commissions, etc.; and

WHEREAS, it is desirable to amend Sections 33.002 and 36.05(c) to require that appointments to boards, commissions, etc. live within the corporate limits of the city.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SPRINGFIELD, ILLINOIS:

Section 1: That the City Council hereby amends Chapter 33, Section 33.002, of the 1988 City of Springfield Code of Ordinances, as amended, as follows:

§ 33.002. - Boards, commissions, etc.; creation, appointment, residency and removal.

- (a) The members of any city board, commission, bureau, agency or council shall, except as otherwise provided by this Code, be appointed subject to city council confirmation, by the mayor. Once appointed, the members shall, except as otherwise provided by this Code, be subject to removal by the mayor and shall serve at his pleasure.
- (b) The members of any board, commission, bureau, agency or council created by statute or by some other governmental body, wherein the city is given the right to appoint and/or remove members thereof, shall be appointed and/or removed in the manner prescribed therein unless the city, pursuant to its home rule power, is entitled to and does in fact alter the manner of appointment and/or removal.
- (c) All individuals appointed by the city council or any of its individual members to serve on boards, bureaus, and commissions shall reside within the corporate limits of the city unless otherwise approved by the city council.
- (\underline{d}) Terms of office of all members of city boards, commissions, bureaus, agencies or councils shall be as specified in the ordinance creating

them and until their successors are appointed and confirmed by the city council.

- (d) (e) A vacancy on any city board, commission, bureau, agency or council shall be filled in the same manner as the original appointment for the remainder of the unexpired term, unless otherwise provided by this Code.
- (e) (f) All city boards, commissions, bureaus, agencies or councils in existence on November 30, 1987, shall continue in existence unless and until changed by the city council. All members thereof shall continue to serve until their terms expire or they are removed in accordance with law or this Code. For the purposes of administrative supervision, the respective city boards, commissions, bureaus, agencies and councils shall be subordinate to the executive assistant to the mayor.
- $\frac{\text{(f)}}{\text{(g)}}$ All city boards, commissions, bureaus, agencies or councils shall have authority to ratify, adopt and amend by-laws to provide internal governance, structure and rules to be applied during their respective meetings.

Section 2: That the City Council hereby amends Chapter 36, Section 36.05, of the 1988 City of Springfield Code of Ordinances, as amended, as follows:

§ 36.05. - Residency requirement.

- The following persons employed by the city shall maintain their bona fide residence within the corporate limits of the city during all periods of service with the city: the executive assistant to the mayor, the corporation counsel, the director of the office of budget and management, the director of the office of planning and economic development, the director of the office of human resources, the director of the office of public utilities, the director of the office of public works, the director of homeland security, the director of the office of information systems, the director of the office of inspector general, the director of the office of communications, the director of the office of community relations, the director of the office of education liaison, the director of the convention and visitors bureau, the director of the office of public health, the chief of the fire department and the chief of the police department. The terms "reside" and "residence" denote that a person has a permanent abode or home in a particular place, and a person may not have a permanent residence in two places at the same time. In order to have one's residence in a particular place, one must both establish a physical presence there and have the intent to make that place his permanent residence.
- (b) The failure of any person described in subsection (a) to maintain their residency within the corporate limits of the city as required by subsection (a) shall be grounds for discharge.
- (c) All individuals appointed by the city council or any of its individual members to serve on boards, bureaus, and commissions, after January 1, 1989, shall reside within the corporate limits of the city unless otherwise approved by the

city council. This restriction will not pertain to any special advisory committees that may periodically be established by the city council or to the building code board of appeals, the electrical commission, the plumbing commission, the elevator commission or the mechanical commission.

 $(\underline{\text{dc}})$ No nonresident under subsection (a) shall be employed for more than 12 months after beginning such employment unless he shall have moved within the corporate limits.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 32, SECTION 32.06 OF THE 1988 SPRINGFIELD CITY CODE OF ORDINANCES, AS AMENDED, PERTAINING TO POWERS AND DUTIES OF THE MAYOR REGARDING EXECUTIVE ORDERS

WHEREAS, the City of Springfield is a home rule unit as defined in Article VII, Section 6(a) of the 1970 Illinois Constitution and has jurisdiction over matters pertaining to its government and affairs; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the City of Springfield, Illinois, to amend Chapter 32, Section 32.06 of the 1988 Springfield City Code of Ordinances, as amended, pertaining to powers and duties of mayor by adding subsection (a) to 32.06(c)(4) to provide that executive orders shall be filed the next business day with the City Clerk.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SPRINGFIELD, ILLINOIS:

<u>Section 1</u>: That the City Council hereby amends Chapter 32, by adding subsection (a) to 32.06(c)(4) of the 1988 City of Springfield Code of Ordinances, as amended, as follows:

§ 32.06. Powers and duties of mayor.

- (a) The mayor shall have those powers prescribed by the settlement agreement, by law and by ordinances of the city.
- (b) The mayor shall exercise control over all appointed offices and subordinate departments set forth in section 32.05 of this Code and all officers and employees therein. He shall have charge and supervision over all property, buildings and equipment assigned to the office of mayor and its subordinate offices and departments.
- (c) Without limiting those powers and duties prescribed by the settlement agreement, by law and by ordinance, the mayor shall:
 - (1) Sign all contracts on behalf of the city;
 - (2) Require and cause to be prepared and published statements and reports required by law, ordinance, or resolution of the council;
 - (3) Grant and sign all commissions, licenses, and permits granted by authority of the council, except as otherwise provided;
 - (4) Perform such other acts and deeds as by law or ordinance may require his official signature;
 - (a) Any executive order issued shall be filed the next business day with the City Clerk.
 - (5) Sign all bonds issued by the city and use facsimile signatures for the coupons attached to those bonds.

WHEREAS, the policy provides procedures and protections for City employees who report fraud and misconduct by other City employees, and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the City to amend Chapter 36.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SPRINGFIELD, ILLINOIS:

Section 1: The City Council of the City of Springfield, Illinois, hereby amends Chapter 36 of the 1988 City of Springfield Code of Ordinances, as amended, as outlined in Exhibit A of this Ordinance, which is attached hereto and made a part hereof.

Section 2: The City of Springfield Office of the City Clerk is hereby directed to publish this ordinance in pamphlet form.

<u>Section 3</u>: This ordinance shall become effective 10 days after its passage, publication in pamphlet form, and recording with the City of Springfield Office of the City Clerk.

§36.80. Whistleblower Policy.

(a) Purpose.

The City of Springfield encourages employees who have good-faith concerns regarding wrongful conduct to report such concerns. The purpose of this policy is:

- (1) To define employee and management responsibility for reporting fraud, potential or actual, or misconduct and to establish procedures for addressing wrongful conduct, and
- (2) To protect any employee who engages in good faith disclosure of alleged wrongful conduct to the City.
- (3) To offer guidance on conflict of interest, whistleblowing, or violation of the gift ban act.

Specifically, this policy encourages employees to disclose serious breaches of conduct covered by City policies or state/federal law and protects employees from reprisal by adverse employment action as a result of having disclosed wrongful conduct or participated in an ethics-related investigation. Nothing in this policy is intended to interfere with legitimate employment decisions.

The Director of Human Resources shall serve as the City's Ethics Officer and shall act as a resource for any questions or concerns regarding the interpretation of this policy.

(b) Wrongful Conduct.

Wrongful conduct can entail the following:

- (1) A serious violation of City policy;
- (2) A violation of applicable state or federal law, regulation or rules;
- (3) Embezzlement or other financial irregularities; and/or
- (4) Fraudulent/gross misuse of City property, resources or authority.

Examples of wrongful misconduct covered under this policy include but are not limited to such actions as:

- (1) Theft, misappropriation, destruction, removal, or concealment of City resources;
- (2) Forgery, falsification, or alteration of documents;
- (3) <u>Improprieties/misrepresentation in the handling or reporting of money or financial transactions;</u>
- (4) Authorizing or receiving payment for goods not received or services not performed;
- (5) Misuse of City facilities;
- (6) Accepting or offering bribes, kickbacks, or rebates; and/or
- (7) Actions relating to concealing or perpetuating above mentioned activities.

Those acting on behalf of the City have a general duty to conduct themselves in a manner that will maintain and strengthen the public's trust and confidence in the integrity of the City and take no actions incompatible with their obligations to the City. City employees are responsible for safeguarding City resources and ensuring that they are used only for authorized purposes, in accordance with City rules, policies, and applicable law.

It is a violation of City policy for any employee to receive or use City resources for non-City purposes or personal gain. Management employees are responsible for detecting fraudulent activities or misconduct in their areas of responsibility. Each manager should be familiar with the types of improprieties that might occur in his/her area and be alert for any indication that improper or dishonest activity is or was in existence in his or her area. When dishonest or improper activity is detected or suspected, management should determine whether an error or misunderstanding has occurred or whether possible fraud exists.

(c) Employee Responsibility Regarding Wrongful Conduct.

An employee who has particular knowledge of specific acts, which the employee in good faith believes, constitute wrongful conduct should disclose the conduct to the employee's supervisor or any appropriate member of management. If the wrongful conduct involves the employee's supervisor, the disclosure may be made to another supervisor, a Division Head, a Department Head, the Director of Human Resources, the Corporation Counsel or the Mayor.

The reporting employee shall refrain from further involvement in the matter unless directed by the Director of Human Resources or the Corporation Counsel. City employees are required to cooperate with the City of Springfield and law enforcement agencies in the detection, reporting and investigation of wrongful conduct.

(d) Confidentiality.

In matters of disclosure, the City will make all reasonable efforts to respect the confidentiality of the employee making the disclosure as long as maintaining confidentiality does not interfere with conducting an investigation of the specific allegations, taking corrective action, or in circumstances when (1) the employee agrees to be identified; (2) identification is necessary to allow City or law enforcement officials to investigate or respond effectively to the report; (3) identification is required by law; or (4) the accused person(s) is entitled to the information in a disciplinary proceeding. Where findings are required to be reported to any outside agency or entity, findings will be timely reported. The City maintains records of these allegations.

(e) Retaliation Prohibited.

Retaliation is defined as reprimand, discharge, suspension, demotion or denial of promotion or transfer, or change in the terms and conditions of employment that occurs in retaliation for an employee's good faith disclosure of wrongful conduct of another City employee.

Retaliation for disclosing or threatening to disclose wrongful conduct under this policy is strictly prohibited. Retaliation for providing information to or testifying before any public body conducting an investigation hearing or inquiry into a violation of law, rule or regulations is also strictly prohibited.

The City will investigate all complaints of retaliation and will take appropriate corrective action against any employee who engages in retaliation, up to and including dismissal.

(f) False Allegation.

Any employee who provides false information or makes a false report of wrongful conduct or a subsequent false report of retaliation will be subject to disciplinary action, up to and including discharge.

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING A MACARTHUR BOULEVARD CORRIDOR TAX INCREMENT FINANCE ADVISORY GROUP

WHEREAS, the City of Springfield is a home rule unit as defined in Article VII, Section 6(a) of the 1970 Illinois Constitution and has jurisdiction over matters pertaining to its government and affairs; and

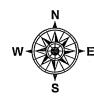

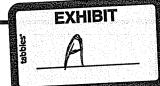

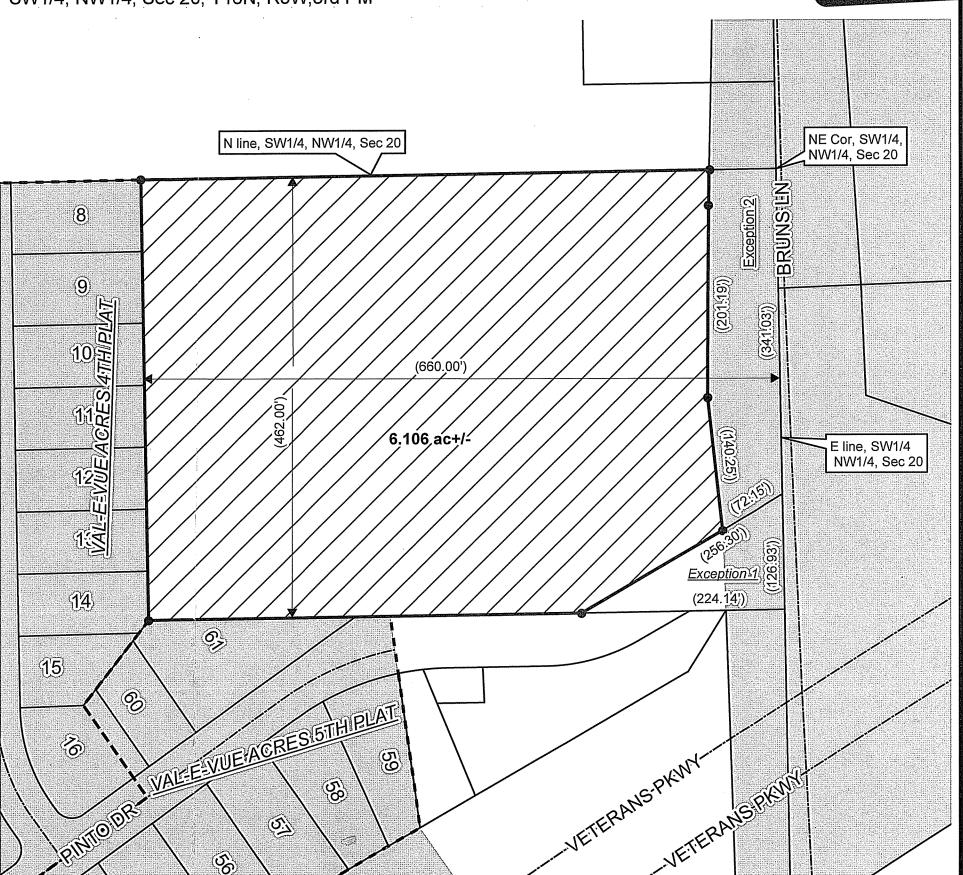

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 170 OF THE 1988 CITY OF SPRINGFIELD CODE OF ORDINANCES BY ADDING SECTION 170.17.67 PERTAINING TO VACANT BUILDINGS ACQUIRED BY FINANCIAL INSTITUTIONS

WHEREAS, the City of Springfield is a home rule unit as defined in Article VII, Section 6(a) of the 1970 Illinois Constitution and has jurisdiction over matters pertaining to its government and affairs; and

WHEREAS, as a result of the recession which began in 2008, financial institutions have obtained possession of properties through foreclosure or deeds in lieu of foreclosure; and

WHEREAS, many properties which have been acquired by financial institutions are vacant buildings under the Springfield City Code; and

WHEREAS, financial institutions which are now in possession of vacant buildings actively market such properties and therefore use licensed realtors to do so; and

WHEREAS, the Springfield City Council desires to encourage the active marketing of properties involuntarily acquired by financial institutions and has worked with representatives of local realtors to better encourage such active marketing and has arrived at mutual agreement on how to address this issue,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SPRINGFIELD, ILLINOIS:

Section 1: That the City Council of the City of Springfield, Illinois, hereby amends Chapter 170 of the 1988 City of Springfield Code of Ordinances, as amended, by adding section 170.17.67 as shown on Exhibit A attached hereto.

Section 2: That Section 170.17.67 is a pilot program which will be repealed on August 31, 2016, unless the City Council votes prior to that date to extend Section 170.17.67.

EXHIBIT A

170.17.67. Actively Managed and Marketed Properties

- (a) An 'Actively Managed and Marketed Property' means a property that is:
 - (i) in foreclosure or is owned by a bank or other financial institution as a consequence of foreclosure;
 - (ii) vacant; and
 - (iii) assigned for management and brokerage by a financial institution to an individual licensed as a Broker or Managing Broker under the Illinois Real Estate License Act and will be listed for sale, or lease, by a Licensed Real Estate Brokerage.
- (b) Actively managed and marketed properties are exempt from the fee and registration requirements of this ordinance for a period of 90 days from the time that a notice to register is sent from the Department of Building and Zoning as required in 170.17.57, except as otherwise set forth in this Section.
- (c) A broker is automatically eligible by notifying the Department of Building and Zoning and proving documentation that it has been retained by a financial institution to manage and market the property within 30 days of the notice to register. It is the broker's duty to report that the property is being actively marketed and managed. A broker must do business in and have a business address in Sangamon County, Illinois, or in an adjacent county, and must provide to the Department of Building and Zoning (1) a listing contract with the financial institution and (2) a brokerage license from the State of Illinois. If the property in question in subject to a master contract, the master contract may be substituted for the listing contract.
- (d) Upon notification to the Department of Building and Zoning that a property is being actively marketed and managed by a broker, the broker must schedule an initial external inspection of the vacant property. After inspection the property will be assigned one of the following classifications of exemption from the registration requirement:
 - (i) Class 1 Violation(s): requires abatement of all violations within 90 days from the notice to register and after a broker has notified the Department of Building and Zoning that a property is actively managed and marketed. No registration is necessary if violations are corrected within 90 days from the notice to register. If violations are not abated within 90 days from the date of the notice to register, the property must be registered as a vacant building, pursuant to Division 5 of Article 7 of Chapter 170 of the City of Springfield Code of Ordinances. If the violations are not abated within 90 days from the notice to register, the three-year period set forth in Section 170.17.58 shall run from the date of the initial notice to register. Status as a Class 1 property neither releases a property owner from being cited for each violation separately, nor from the resulting fines if the violations are not remediated. Properties that have the following violations, and only the following violations, shall be classified as Class 1:

- (1) Accumulation of Garbage/Debris/Solid Waste
- (2) Weeds exceeding 10 inches
- (3) Abandoned and Inoperable Vehicles
- (4) Lack of window screens where necessary
- (5) Cracked Windows
- (6) Peeling paint less than 50% of total area
- (7) Soffit damage less than 50% of total area
- (8) Fascia damage less than 50% of total area
- (9) Siding damage less than 50% of total area
- (10) Tuckpointing less than 50% of total area

The percentages listed in factors (6) through (10) above are intended to be approximations only; the listing of such percentages shall not be construed as requiring mathematical certainty.

- (ii) Class 2 Violation(s): Registration pursuant to Division 5 of Article 7 of Chapter 170 of the City of Springfield Code of Ordinances, including submission of a vacant building plan, is required after 90 days from the notice to register and after a broker has notified the Department of Building and Zoning that a property is actively managed and marketed, but a Certificate of Occupancy is not required upon abatement of all violations by the property owner. If the violations are not abated within 90 days from the notice to register, the three-year period set forth in Section 170.17.58 shall run from the date of the initial notice to register. Properties that have the following violations, and only the following violations, shall be classified as Class 2:
 - (1) Minor roof repair/roof covering replacement that does not provide access to the interior of the structure
 - (2) Masonry tuckpointing greater than 50% of total area
 - (3) Soffits greater than 50% of total area
 - (4) Gutters greater than 50% of total area
 - (5) Fascia greater than 50% of total area
 - (6) Chipping/Peeling paint greater than 50% of total area
 - (7) Deteriorated siding greater than 50% of total area
 - (8) Broken windows not open to trespass
 - (9) Stairs less than 30" in height

(10) Handrails - for stairs less than 30" in height

The percentages listed in factors (2) through (7) above are intended to be approximations only; the listing of such percentages shall not be construed as requiring mathematical certainty.

- (iii) Class 3 Violation(s): Requires registration, including submission of a vacant building plan, pursuant to Division 5 of Article 7 of Chapter 170 of the City of Springfield Code of Ordinances. If the violations are not abated within 90 days from the notice to register, the three-year period set forth in Section 170.17.58 shall run from the date of the initial notice to register. Properties that have the following violations, and only the following violations, shall be classified as Class 3:
 - (1) Structural roof failure
 - (2) Structural floor failure
 - (3) Load-bearing wall failure
 - (4) Beam failure
 - (5) Load-bearing column failure
 - (6) Structure stair failure
 - (7) Guardrails/Handrails for stairs greater than 30" in height
 - (8) Foundation failure
 - (9) Hazardous electrical components
 - (10) Hazardous gas supply system
 - (11) Hazardous furnace
 - (12) Hazardous water heater
 - (13) Hazardous flues
 - (14) Non-functioning sewer system
 - (15) Non-functioning water supply
- (e) The highest level of any violation present at inspection shall determine the class assigned to the property.
- (f) Acknowledgement by Purchaser: in all cases when an actively managed and marketed property is transferred, the new owner, at the time of transfer, must acknowledge all notice of violations and existing violations in writing. Failure by a Purchaser to acknowledge the notice of violations and existing violations shall not be a defense to any violations of this Division.

(g) If the broker does not raise the exemption allowed in this section within 30 days of the notice to register, then the exemption is waived.

§ 170.17.699. Penalty for violation of article.

- (a) Any person who shall violate any provisions of division 5, unless another penalty is provided, shall, upon conviction, be punished by a fine of not less than \$300 and no more than \$750. Each day the violation continues constitutes a separate, punishable offense. In addition to this penalty, the department may utilize any other statutory or common law remedies.
- (b) If the owner of the building fails to comply with the notice to register within ten days after the date of mailing of the notice, the department may file a complaint in the circuit court or with the City Code hearing department requesting the registration of the building by the owner.

ANNUAL APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF SPRINGFIELD, ILLINOIS, FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING MARCH 1, 2015 & ENDING FEBRUARY 29, 2016.

WHEREAS, the City of Springfield is a home rule unit as defined in Article VII, Section 6(a) of the 1970 Illinois Constitution and has jurisdiction over matters pertaining to its government and affairs; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Illinois Municipal Code (65 ILCS 5/8-2-9) and Section 37.01 of the 1988 City of Springfield Code of Ordinances, as amended, an annual appropriation ordinance shall be adopted by the city council before the beginning of the fiscal year to which it applies.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SPRINGFIELD, ILLINOIS:

Section 1: The Director of the Office of Budget and Management shall allocate, from time to time, monies received by the City to the credit of respective funds designated in Exhibit 1 entitled "City of Springfield FY16 Total Resources" in such proportion as may be required for the best interest of the City and to meet the financial requirements of the City for the fiscal year beginning March 1, 2015, and ending on February 29, 2016. Such allocations shall be reflected on the books, records and accounts of the City, which shall be subject to public inspection. Taxes to be collected in calendar year 2015 from those taxes levied in calendar year 2014 upon all taxable property subject to taxation within the City pursuant to Ordinance No. 415-12-14, passed by the City Council on December 2, 2014, for the purposes set forth in Ordinance No. 415-12-14 are included in the FY16 Total Resources attached hereto as Exhibit 1.

Section 2: The sums of money shown in the "Major Object" lines in Exhibit 2 entitled "City of Springfield FY16 Appropriations" are hereby appropriated for the purposes stated therein and for the Organizational Divisions set forth in Exhibit 2 entitled "City of Springfield FY16 Appropriations" to defray necessary expenses and liabilities of the City of Springfield, to be paid or incurred during the fiscal year beginning March 1, 2015 and ending on February 29, 2016.

Section 3: No expenditure exceeding the appropriation for any major object or purpose stated in the attached forms shall be made by any Office of the City except as authorized by the City Council. However, nothing in this section shall prohibit an Office from requesting a supplemental appropriation in the event of receipt of unanticipated revenue over and above that Office's projected revenue as established by the Office of Budget and Management. Likewise, nothing in this section shall prohibit the Office of Budget and Management from sequestering any appropriation of any Office in the event that designated Office revenues are less than projected. The Office of Budget and Management shall review each Office's actual revenues and expenditures and recommend such modifications to the budget for City Council consideration as may be appropriate.

Section 4: Proceeds received by the City as a result of any financing or refinancing of bonds or loans shall be used only for completion of improvements and equipment acquisitions for public buildings or infrastructure owned by the City of Springfield and shall not be used for any other purpose unless approved by the City Council.

Section 5: All Offices of the City shall submit, upon request of the Office of Budget and Management, all books and records which relate to monies received or paid out by the Offices, debts and accounts receivable or amounts owed by the Offices, and program performance information as may be useful

to the Office of Budget and Management for purposes of compiling a municipal budget. All information submitted by the Offices shall be in a format developed by the Office of Budget and Management in cooperation with Offices of the City.

Section 6: In order to balance the City's appropriation with anticipated revenues and provide adequate cash flow, the Director of the Office of Budget and Management is hereby authorized and directed to make loans between the various accounts and funds of the City, to the extent not otherwise restricted, at the applicable interest rate, if any, required by law.

<u>Section 7</u>: There are existing multi-year contracts which are previously adopted and approved by ordinances of the City Council of the City of Springfield. These contracts are expressly included by reference and approved to be charged against appropriations authorized by this ordinance.

Section 8: This Appropriation Ordinance is adopted pursuant to procedures set forth in the Illinois Municipal Code, provided any limitations in the Illinois Municipal Code in conflict with this Ordinance shall not be applicable to this Ordinance, pursuant to Section 6 of Article VII of the Constitution of the State of Illinois.

<u>Section 9</u>: The City Clerk is hereby directed to publish this ordinance in pamphlet form.

Section 10: This ordinance shall become effective immediately upon its passage and recording by the City Clerk.

The parties agree that if any provision of the Plan is or shall be prohibited by law or any modification be required by law, the Committee shall promptly meet to bargain over necessary revisions. The City shall promptly submit any collectively-bargained revisions of the Plan agreed to by the Committee to the City Council for ratification.
- 4. The provisions of the Plan as described in Appendix 1 may be modified as to bargaining unit employees represented by Unions that are parties to this Agreement only upon the 3/4th majority agreement of all of the members of the Joint Labor/Management Health Care Committee. The City shall promptly submit any such collectively-bargained modifications of the Plan to the City Council for ratification.
- 5. Each of the parties has full authority of its governing board, its membership, or whatever group or subgroup within its structure has the ultimate authority to enter into this Agreement. Each of the parties represents to each of the other parties as an inducement to enter into this Agreement that it has such authority and that it intends to and does bind itself and each of its members to the terms of this Agreement. For the three year period, this Committee shall be the exclusive forum for dealing with non-duty related health care issues and during the three year period each of the parties specifically waives any rights it may otherwise have under the Illinois Public Labor Relations Act or otherwise to bargain over the subject of health care

or insurance or to impose other terms or to strike or arbitrate concerning other terms for health care coverage or benefits.

The parties agree that should any dispute concerning the interpretation or application of this Agreement arises between the Unions and the City which cannot be resolved after good faith efforts, it shall be submitted to binding arbitration pursuant to the terms of the Uniform Arbitration Act (710 ILCS 5/1 et seq.), It is understood that this provision for arbitration shall not apply to operation of the Plan itself or to any individual claims or disputes under the Plan.

To select an arbitrator, the parties in dispute, by joint letter, shall request that the Federal Mediation and Conciliation Services (FMCS) submit a panel list of seven (7) arbitrators, all with National Academy of Arbitrators (NAA) credentials. The representatives of the parties shall meet within ten (10) days of their receipt of this list from FMCS and engage in a mutual striking process to select an arbitrator. Each party shall have the right to reject one entire list, provided such rejection occurs within five (5) days of the receipt of the list. The parties shall alternately strike a name from the list until there is one name remaining, with the order of striking to be determined by coin toss. The arbitrator shall be notified of his/her selection by joint letter, requesting that a hearing be scheduled in Springfield, Illinois, on mutually agreed dates, subject to the reasonable availability of the parties and their representatives.

Both parties agree to attempt to arrive at a joint stipulation of the facts and issues as outlined to be submitted to the arbitrator. Both parties have the right to request the arbitrator to require the presence of witnesses and/or reasonable documents. Employees of the City called to testify at the arbitration shall be released from duty for such purposes without loss of pay or benefits. The arbitrator shall have no authority to amend, modify, nullify, ignore, add or subtract from the provisions of this Agreement. The arbitrator shall consider and decide the issue(s) presented and fashion an appropriate remedy. The arbitrator's decision shall be rendered and delivered in writing to the parties within thirty (30) days of the close of the hearings or submission of post-hearing briefs, whichever is later. Post-hearing briefs shall be filed simultaneously by the parties on the date

established by the arbitrator. Fees and expenses of the arbitrator, the cost of the hearing room, and the cost of a court reporter to provide written transcript for the arbitrator shall be shared equally by the City and the Unions. If either party desires a copy of the transcript, it shall pay for the cost of its copy.

- 6. The parties to this Agreement, in consideration of their mutual undertakings and obligations, mutually agree for the three year period that this Agreement represents a collectively bargained agreement between and among all of the parties and that no provisions concerning health care or insurance shall be raised as an issue in any other collective bargaining agreement, contract collective bargaining negotiations or other collective bargaining negotiations over terms and conditions of employment between those exclusive representatives and the City of Springfield.
- 7. The Committee shall be composed of 12 members appointed by the parties:
 - A. The member unions shall appoint 6 bargaining unit members to be members.
 - B. The City shall appoint 6 persons to the Committee as representatives of Management.

Members of the Committee shall be appointed for a term of 3 years unless sooner replaced by the appointing authority. Recognizing the need for stability in the Committee, each of the parties and participating groups agree insofar as it is practical to maintain the same representatives on the Committee for the term of this Agreement. If it becomes necessary to replace one of its previously designated representatives, such party or group will notify the cochairs of the Committee in writing as soon as practical and not less than 5 days prior to any regular Committee meeting.

- 8. The Committee shall determine its own internal structure.
- 9. The Committee shall meet on a regular basis, as needed.

In consideration of the Unions agreeing to jointly bargain with the City on the issue of employee health insurance coverage, the City agrees to provide administrative support to the Committee as needed.

10. This agreement shall only become effective upon the agreement of all of the parties as identified in I above, Unless extended by the agreement of all the parties, this agreement shall expire effective the close of business February 28, 2018.

Questions and answers about the Coverage Examples:

What are some of the assumptions behind the Coverage Examples?

- Costs don't include **premiums**.
- Sample care costs are based on national averages supplied by the U.S.
 Department of Health and Human Services, and aren't specific to a particular geographic area or health plan.
- The patient's condition was not an excluded or preexisting condition.
- All services and treatments started and ended in the same coverage period.
- There are no other medical expenses for any member covered under this plan.
- Out-of-pocket expenses are based only on treating the condition in the example.
- The patient received all care from innetwork <u>providers</u>. If the patient had received care from out-of-network <u>providers</u>, costs would have been higher.

What does a Coverage Example show?

For each treatment situation, the Coverage Example helps you see how <u>deductibles</u>, <u>copayments</u>, and <u>coinsurance</u> can add up. It also helps you see what expenses might be left up to you to pay because the service or treatment isn't covered or payment is limited.

Does the Coverage Example predict my own care needs?

No. Treatments shown are just examples. The care you would receive for this condition could be different based on your doctor's advice, your age, how serious your condition is, and many other factors.

Does the Coverage Example predict my future expenses?

No. Coverage Examples are not cost estimators. You can't use the examples to estimate costs for an actual condition. They are for comparative purposes only. CONTRACT FOR PROCUREMENT OF SERVICES

ARTICLE 1. IDENTIFICATION OF PARTIES

The parties to this contract are:

(a) The Board of Trustees of the University of Illinois, a body corporate and politic of the State of Illinois ("University"), on behalf of Campus Police and (b) City of Springfield, a(n) Government Entity with its principal office at 300 South 7th Street Municipal Center West 210 Springfield, Illinois 62701 ("Vendor") or ("YÖU").

ARTICLE 2. SCOPE OF SERVICES

2.1. Services. Vendor will perform the following "Services" and will obtain at Vendor's expense all necessary licenses and permissions necessary for Vendor's performance:

Vendor will provide fire protection services for all property (real and personal) owend by the Board of Trustees of the University of Illinois located in the Southeast part of the City of Springfield, Illinois, and operated as a higher education institution, as is more generally depicted in Exhibit A.

- 2.2. Type of Services. The Services are General
- 2.3. Discrepancies/Questions. If any discrepancies or questions arise during Vendor's performance of the contract, Vendor is responsible for obtaining written clarification from University's Technical Representative before providing the Services at issue. Vendor waives all claims for adjustment arising from Vendor's performance outside the scope of Services without a written contract amendment.

ARTICLE 3. TERM AND TERMINATION

- **3.1. Term.** The term of this Agreement shall be July 01, 2015 or from the date signed by the last party to sign this Agreement through June 30, 2016.
- **3.2.** Renewal Options. This contract cannot be renewed if originally made by the following exceptions to competitive selection requirements: (i) a small purchase, (ii) an emergency purchase; (iii) or a contract for professional and artistic services under \$20,000 for a term of one year or less. This contract is non-renewable.
- **3.3. Termination for Cause.** A party that defaults in performance or commits a material breach of this contract ("defaulting party") shall have 10 days to cure the default or breach after receiving notice from the other party. The other party may terminate this contract without further notice if the defaulting party fails to cure the breach within the prescribed period, or within an agreed period of time.
- **3.4. Termination for Convenience.** University may terminate this contract for convenience after providing to Vendor prior written notice of at least 30 calendar days. This contract is subject to termination by University in any year for which the General Assembly fails to make an appropriation to make payments under the contract.
- **3.5.** Effect of Termination. In the event of early termination for any cause, Vendor shall stop performance in accordance with the notice of termination and shall submit to University a final bill for Services performed to the date of termination. University is not obligated to pay Vendor for Services until Vendor provides all Work Product. Vendor must comply with University's instructions to either destroy or return to University all information previously furnished to Vendor.

ARTICLE 4. COMPENSATION

4.1. Compensation. University shall pay Vendor compensation at the rate of \$51,311.00 for Services performed to University's reasonable satisfaction. University's obligation for total compensation shall not exceed \$51,311.00 unless approved by written amendment to this contract in accordance with University policies.

- **4.2.** Billing and Payment. In order to be paid, Vendor must submit a proper invoice or bill in duplicate to University's Technical Representative no more frequently than monthly. A proper bill must include: itemized detail, invoice number, invoice date, invoice amount, remittance address and the University purchase order number. University will either approve the bill for payment, or deny a bill with defects, within 90 days of its receipt. University will assign a new date of receipt to a bill resubmitted in proper form. University will pay interest at the rate of 1% a month on approved bills not paid within the 90-day period. University will not pay interest of \$5 or less and may apply discounts before payment.
- **4.3.** Withholdings. University may withhold or may void any invoice to the extent University deems necessary to protect University from loss due to Vendor's: (a) unsatisfactory performance; (b) failure to pay subcontractors; (c) damage to University property; or (d) incomplete, inaccurate or unauthorized billing. University may withhold final payment until Vendor has performed all Services to University's satisfaction.
- 4.4. Price Adjustments upon Renewal. If renewals are permitted, Vendor must notify University at least 60 calendar days prior to contract expiration of any changes to rates and price schedules based upon Vendor's original quotation or response to solicitation. The parties will reflect any rate/price changes in a contract amendment.

ARTICLE 5. NOTICES

- **5.1. Delivery.** To be enforceable, all notices must be in writing and delivered to the party's representative named below by either certified mail, return receipt requested, or commercial carrier with delivery receipt. Notices are effective upon receipt by the designated representative. A party may change its representative at any time by written notice to the other party.
- **5.2. Directing Notices.** Vendor shall direct all general notices or matters of contract interpretation to University Contract Representative and notices involving technical or scheduling issues to University's Technical Representative. Vendor must include University's contract number or relevant purchase order number in any notice.

Vendor shall ensure that all subcontractors comply with the same insurance requirements imposed on Vendor. Vendor's failure to comply with these insurance requirements constitutes a material breach of this contract.

ARTICLE 7. INDEMNIFICATION

Vendor shall fully indemnify University and its Trustees, officers, employees, agents ("University Indemnitees") against all liabilities, losses, costs, and expenses (including reasonable attorney fees) arising from any injury or death or loss of or damage to property for which University Indemnitees become liable as a result of the acts and omissions of Vendor and Vendor's subcontractors.

ARTICLE 8. SUBCONTRACTS

Vendor shall provide an attachment listing all known or anticipated subcontracts with an annual value of \$25,000 or more. The attachment shall include the proposed value of each subcontract and the name and address of the subcontractor. Vendor shall not subcontract any portion of the Services without University's prior written permission and shall promptly notify University of any proposed change in subcontractors, together with all relevant information requested by University.

ARTICLE 9. CONFIDENTIALITY

9.1. General. Vendor must treat all information relating to this contract as confidential ("University Information"). Unless required by law, Vendor shall not disclose University Information to third parties or use University Information for any purpose other than in performing the Services except as authorized in advance in writing by University.

ARTICLE 10. RIGHTS IN WORK PRODUCT

- 10.1. Title to Work Product. Title to all Work Product made under this contract vests in University upon delivery by Vendor. University shall have the exclusive right to use Work Product for any purpose without further obligation to Vendor. Vendor represents that Work Product is original and does not infringe on third party rights. Vendor will not place any restrictive markings upon Work Product.
- 10.2. Pre-Existing Rights: University shall not claim any interest in Vendor's materials, products, inventions or know-how existing prior to formation of this contract. Vendor grants to University a royalty-free, nonexclusive, irrevocable, worldwide license to make, use, sell, and to reproduce, distribute, prepare derivative works and perform, as the case may be, any pre-existing materials, products, inventions or know-how delivered by Vendor to University under this contract.
- 10.3. Third Party Property. Vendor shall not incorporate into the Work Product any third party property without University's prior written authorization. If University permits Vendor's use of third party property in the Work Product, Vendor must obtain for University a license at no cost to University that will enable University to use the Work Product without restriction. Vendor shall defend and indemnify University against all third party claims for infringements related to the Work Product unless otherwise expressly agreed by University in writing.

ARTICLE 11. RECORDS AND AUDIT

- 11.1. Right of Inspection. University may reasonably inspect Vendor's premises, facilities, equipment, and investigate the business reputation and other qualifications of Vendor and any of Vendor's subcontractors throughout the term of this contract.
- 11.2. Litigation Hold Order Compliance. Vendor shall, and shall cause Vendor's employees and subcontractors to, fully comply with any litigation hold order issued by University in anticipation of third party litigation relating to this contract. Vendor shall promptly retrieve, recover, preserve, and retain and, subject to legal privileges, deliver any information and documents, in any format, covered by a litigation hold order.

ARTICLE 12. GENERAL TERMS

- **12.1. Ambiguities.** Any rule of construction that would resolve ambiguities against the drafting party shall not apply in interpreting this contract.
- **12.2.** Amendments. No modification of this contract shall be effective unless made by a written amendment signed by each party's authorized signatory.
- **12.3. Assignment.** Neither party may assign its obligations under this contract without the prior written consent of the other party.
- **12.4. Authorized Signatories.** The individuals signing this contract on a party's behalf represent that they have the requisite authority and intent to bind that party to this contract.
- **12.5.** Choice of Law. This contract shall be interpreted by application of Illinois law without regard to its conflicts provisions.
- **12.6. Compliance with Laws.** YOU shall perform YOUR obligations in compliance with all relevant laws governing YOUR performance. Breach of this provision constitutes a material breach of this contract.
- **12.7.** Counterparts/Facsimile Signatures. This contract may be signed in counterparts. Facsimile signatures constitute original signatures for all purposes.
- 12.8. Excluded Parties. YOU certify that neither YOU nor any of YOUR directors, officers, employees, agents or subcontractors who may provide services pursuant to this contract (collectively "Agents") is presently debarred, suspended, proposed for debarment, declared ineligible or otherwise excluded from transactions with the U.S. Government or by any federal government agency. YOU shall provide University immediate written notice if YOU learn that this certification was erroneous when made or if YOU or any of YOUR Agents hereafter becomes debarred, suspended, proposed for debarment, declared ineligible or otherwise excluded from transactions with the U.S. Government or by any Federal agency. YOU further certify that neither YOU

nor any of YOUR Agents is presently subject to an investigation or proceeding to exclude either as a provider under Medicare or Medicaid or under any other federal or state health care program or under any third party insurance program, nor is currently excluded or debarred from submitting claims to Medicare or Medicaid or to any other federal or state health care program or to any third party insurer. University may terminate this contract immediately without any penalty to University if either of these certifications was erroneous when made and/or becomes no longer valid during the term of this contract.

- **12.9. Force Majeure.** A party is excused from performing its obligations under this contract when conditions beyond its control and unforeseen by the parties make its performance commercially impractical, illegal, or impossible. Conditions of excuse include, but are not limited to: natural disasters, strikes, fires, war, terrorism and threats of terrorism, government actions, and acts or omissions of third parties. So long as the conditions continue, the party whose performance is affected shall keep the other party fully informed about the conditions and the prospects of their ending.
- 12.10. Headings. Headings in this contract are intended only to assist with readability and are not substantive.
- **12.11. Independent Contractor.** The parties are independent contractors with respect to each other. Nothing in this contract is intended to create any association, partnership, joint venture, or agency relationship between them.
- **12.12. Integration.** This contract with its attachments, amendments and incorporated references constitutes the parties' entire agreement regarding the subject matter.

Attachments include:

Exhibit A – Map of UIS

- 12.13. Jurisdiction. Any claims against University must be filed in accordance with the Illinois Court of Claims Act.
- **12.14. Severability.** If any provision of this contract is held by a court of competent jurisdiction to be unenforceable, the provision shall be severed from this contract so long as severance does not affect the enforceability or essential purpose of the remainder of the contract.
- **12.15.** Sovereign Immunity. By entering into this contract, University does not waive the sovereign immunity or any other defenses and immunities afforded to it by Illinois and federal law.
- **12.16.** Use of Name: YOU shall not use University's name or protected marks for any commercial purpose without University's advance written consent.
- **12.17.** Waiver. The failure of either party to enforce any provision of this contract shall not waive the party's right to later enforce the provision or the contract.







ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING A LOAN AGREEMENT FOR \$11,000,000 FROM THE ILLINOIS ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION AGENCY'S WATER POLLUTION CONTROL LOAN PROGRAM

WHEREAS, the City of Springfield, Sangamon County, Illinois, ("City") is a home rule unit of government and operates its sewerage system ("the System") in accordance with the provisions of Article VII, Section 6(a) of the 1970 Illinois Constitution and the Local Government Debt Reform Act, 30 ILCS 350/1 *et seq*. (collectively "the Act"); and

WHEREAS, the mayor and city council of the City ("the Corporate Authorities") have determined that it is advisable, necessary, and in the best interest of the public health, safety, and welfare to improve the System, including the following:

The proposed work ("Work") is officially known as the Sewer Repair and CIPP Project. The work includes installing a cured in place pipe (CIPP) liner system on the sewers identified in the plans. Specifically the work shall include notification to affected property owners, bypass pumping of sewer flows, cleaning the sewers to be lined, addressing any defects that would impact the lining process, lining the sewers with a CIPP lining system, installing T-liner sewer lateral lining systems, and providing post lining video documentation of the liner and sewer restoration. together with any land or rights in land and all electrical, mechanical or other services necessary, useful or advisable to the construction and installation ("the Project"), all in accordance with the plans and specifications prepared by the consulting engineers of the City which Project has a useful life of 50 years; and

WHEREAS, the estimated cost of construction and installation of the Project, including engineering, legal, financial and other related expenses is \$10,690,400, and there are insufficient funds on hand and lawfully available to pay these costs; and

WHEREAS, the loan shall bear an interest rate as defined by 35 Ill. Adm. Code 365, which does not exceed the maximum rate authorized by the Bond Authorization Act, as amended, 30 ILCS 305/0.01 *et seq.*, at the time of the issuance of the loan; and

WHEREAS, the principal and interest payment shall be payable semi-annually, and the loan shall mature in 20 years, which is within the period of useful life of the Project; and

WHEREAS, the costs are expected to be paid for with a loan to the City from the Water Pollution Control Loan Program through the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency, the loan to be repaid from City of Springfield, Sewer Revenue Fund, and the loan is authorized to be accepted at this time pursuant to the Act; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the provisions of the Act, the City is authorized to borrow funds from the Water Pollution Control Loan Program in the aggregate principal amount of \$11,000,000 to provide funds to pay the costs of the Project; and

WHEREAS, the loan to the City shall be made pursuant to a Loan Agreement, including certain terms and conditions between the City and the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SPRINGFIELD, ILLINOIS:

SECTION 1. INCORPORATION OF PREAMBLES

The Corporate Authorities hereby find that the recitals contained in the preambles are true and correct, and incorporate them into this Ordinance by this reference.

SECTION 2. DETERMINATION TO BORROW FUNDS

It is necessary and in the best interests of the City to construct the Project for the public health, safety, and welfare, in accordance with the plans and specifications, as described; that the System continues to be operated in accordance with the provisions of the Illinois Environmental Protection Act, 415 ILCS 5/1 *et seq.*; and that for the purpose of constructing the Project, it is hereby authorized that funds be borrowed by the City in the aggregate principal amount (which can include construction period interest financed over the term of the loan) not to exceed \$11,000,000.

SECTION 3. ADDITIONAL ORDINANCES

The Corporate Authorities may adopt additional ordinances or proceedings supplementing or amending this Ordinance, providing for entering into the Loan Agreement with the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency, prescribing all the details of the Loan Agreement, and providing for the collection, segregation and distribution of the City of Springfield, Sewer Revenue Fund, so long as the maximum amount of the Loan Agreement as set forth in this Ordinance is not exceeded and there is no material change in the project or purposes described herein. Any additional ordinances or proceedings shall in all instances become effective in accordance with the Act or other applicable laws. This Ordinance, together with such additional

ordinances or proceedings, shall constitute complete authority for entering into the Loan Agreement under applicable law.

However, notwithstanding the above, the City may not adopt additional ordinances or amendments which provide for any substantive or material change in the scope and intent of this Ordinance, including but not limited to interest rate, preference or priority of any other ordinance with this Ordinance, parity of any other ordinance with this Ordinance, or otherwise alter or impair the obligation of the City to pay the principal and interest due to the Water Pollution Control Loan Program without the written consent of the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency.

SECTION 4. LOAN NOT INDEBTEDNESS OF CITY OF SPRINGFIELD

Repayment of the loan to the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency by the City pursuant to this Ordinance is to be solely from the revenue derived from Sewer Revenue Fund, and the loan does not constitute an indebtedness of the City within the meaning of any constitutional or statutory limitation.

SECTION 5. APPLICATION FOR LOAN

The mayor is hereby authorized to make an application to the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency for a loan through the Water Pollution Control Loan Program, in accordance with the loan requirements set out in 35 Ill. Adm. Code 365.

SECTION 6. ACCEPTANCE OF LOAN AGREEMENT

The Corporate Authorities hereby authorize acceptance of the offer of a loan through the Water Pollution Control Loan Program, including all terms and conditions of the Loan Agreement as well as all special conditions contained therein and made a part thereof by reference. The Corporate Authorities further agree that the loan funds awarded shall be used solely for the purposes of the project as approved by the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency in accordance with the terms and conditions of the Loan Agreement.

SECTION 7. AUTHORIZATION OF MAYOR TO EXECUTE LOAN AGREEMENT

The mayor is hereby authorized and directed to execute the Loan Agreement with the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency. The Corporate Authorities may authorize by resolution a person other than the mayor for the sole purpose of authorizing or executing any documents associated with payment requests or reimbursements from the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency in connection with this loan.

SECTION 8. SEVERABILITY

If any section, paragraph, clause or provision of this Ordinance is held invalid, the invalidity of such section, paragraph, clause or provision shall not affect any of the other provisions of this Ordinance.

SECTION 9. REPEALER

All ordinances, resolutions, orders, or parts thereof, which conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance, to the extent of such conflict, are hereby repealed.

A RESOLUTION FOR TEMPORARY CLOSURE OF A PORTION OF ILLINOIS STATE ROUTES 97 AND 125 (JEFFERSON STREET FROM 9TH TO 5TH STREETS) FOR THE ST. PATRICK'S DAY PARADE ON MARCH 14, 2015

WHEREAS, the St. Patrick's Day Parade will be held in the City of Springfield, on March 14, 2015, on Jefferson Street from 9th to 5th Streets; and

WHEREAS, Jefferson Street is a State highway; and

WHEREAS, Section 4-408 of the Illinois Highway Code authorizes the Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT) to issue permits to local authorities to temporarily close portions of State Highways for such public purposes.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SPRINGFIELD, ILLINOIS

- **Section 1:** That permission to close Jefferson Street from 9th to 5th Streets on March 15, 2014, be requested of the Illinois Department of Transportation.
- Section 2: That this closure is for the public purpose of the St. Patrick's Day Parade beginning at 9^{th} and Jefferson Streets, then proceeding west on Jefferson Street to 5^{th} Street, then south on 5^{th} Street to Capitol Avenue; then east on Capitol Avenue to 6^{th} Street then north on 6^{th} Street to Washington Street.
- Section 3: That traffic from that closed portion of highway shall be detoured over routes with an all weather surface that can accept the anticipated traffic, which will be maintained to the satisfaction of the Illinois Department of Transportation and which is conspicuously marked for the benefit of traffic diverted from the State Highway. (The parking of vehicles shall be prohibited on the detour routes to allow an uninterrupted flow of two-way traffic.)
- Section 4: That sponsors of the St. Patrick's Day Parade assume full responsibility for the direction, protection and regulation of the traffic during the time the detour is in effect.
- <u>Section 5</u>: That police officers, flaggers, and officials shall permit emergency vehicles in emergency situations to pass through the closed area as swiftly as is safe for all concerned.
- Section 6: That all debris shall be removed by the sponsors of the St. Patrick's Day Parade prior to reopening the State Highway.
- <u>Section 7</u>: That the use of signs, flags, barricades, etc. shall be in accordance with Illinois Department of Transportation rules and regulations.
- Section 8: That the closure and detour shall be marked according to the Illinois Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices.

<u>Section 9</u>: That the sponsors of the St. Patrick's Day Parade hereby agree to assume all liabilities and pay all claims for any damage which shall be occasioned by the closing described above.

<u>Section 10</u>: That the sponsors of the St. Patrick's Day Parade provide a comprehensive general liability insurance policy or an additional insured endorsement in the amount of \$1,000,000 which has the Illinois Department of Transportation and its officials, employees, and agents as additional insureds and which protects them from all claims arising from the requested road closing.

<u>Section 11</u>: That a copy of this Resolution be forwarded to the Illinois Department of Transportation to serve as a formal request for the permission sought in this resolution and to operate as part of the conditions of said permission.



 - (5) The circumstances upon which the request for variance is based are not the result of the subdivider's affirmative act or failure to act; and
 - (6) The purpose of a variation is not based exclusively on the desire to eliminate development costs at the expense of the public improvement standards as outlined in this chapter.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SPRINGFIELD, ILLINOIS:

<u>Section 1</u>: (The City Clerk shall check the following based upon the outcome of the vote.)

- () The City Council agrees with the recommendation of the Land Subdivision Committee and the Regional Planning Commission. In addition, the City Council makes the following findings:

 - (4) The circumstances upon which the request for variance is based are not common to most other tracts of land:

- (5) The circumstances upon which the request for variance is based are not the result of the subdivider's affirmative act or failure to act; and
- (6) The purpose of a variation is not based exclusively on the desire to eliminate development costs at the expense of the public improvement standards as outlined in this chapter.
- () That the City Council disagrees with the recommendation of the Land Subdivision Committee and disagrees with the recommendation of the Land Subdivision Committee and the Regional Planning Commission, and finds that the requirements for a variance are not met.







AN ORDINANCE VACATING THE ALLEY IN THE BLOCK BOUNDED BY CARPENTER, KLEIN, REYNOLDS AND RUTLEDGE STREETS TO MEMORIAL HEALTH SYSTEM

WHEREAS, the City of Springfield is a home rule unit as defined in Article VII, Section 6(a) of the 1970 Illinois Constitution and has jurisdiction over matters pertaining to its government and affairs; and

WHEREAS, Memorial Health System ("Petitioner") has petitioned the City Council requesting vacation of the alley described as follows:

Section 2: That the City Clerk is directed to record a copy of this ordinance together with the plat in the Office of the Sangamon County Recorder of Deeds.
