THIS MATTER, coming on for a hearing before the Springfield Planning and Zoning Commission of the City of Springfield, Illinois, and it appearing to said Commission that a petition for a Reclassification to S-3, Central Shopping District, Section 155.032, and a Variance of Section 155.001, Definitions, Lot, of the Zoning regulations of said City has been filed herein by the above-captioned Petitioner; that Legal publication has been made pursuant to law; and that a public hearing was held on March 18, 2015, pursuant to law, and that said Commission took testimony of witnesses, examined the evidence, otherwise being fully advised in the premises, therefore finds as follows:

- 1. That said Commission has jurisdiction to consider the petition filed herein.
- 2. That the above-captioned petitioner is the owner and/or has a beneficial interest in the property more particularly described as:

Old Town Plat L 3 B4, Old Town Plat L2 W ½ B4, Old Town Plat L2 E ½ B4, Old Town Plat L1 B4 situated in the County of Sangamon and State of Illinois; further identified as 14-27.0-355-001, 14-27.0-355-002, 1427.0-355-003, 14-27.0-355-004.

(i) Existing uses of property within the general area of the property in question.

North: Office. Northeast: Vacant commercial. South: Warehouse/document storage. East and southeast: Mixed residential and commercial. West and southwest: Car sales. Northwest: Medical offices.

(ii) The zoning classification of property within the general area of the property in question.

North: B-2. Northeast; east, south and southeast: S-3. Southwest: B-2. Northeast: I-1.

(iii) The suitability of the property in question to the uses permitted under the existing zoning classification.

The property is primarily vacant and can be developed with uses permitted under any zoning classification.

(iv) The trend of development, if any, in the general area of the property in question, including changes, if any, which have taken place since the day the property in question was placed in its present zoning classification.

The properties in the area were developed a number of years ago with the existing, or similar, uses.

(v) The relationship of the uses allowed under the proposed zoning classification to the Official City Plan.

The subject property is located in the Central Business District for which the City Plan indicates that the area should be a mix of office, commercial and residential uses.

(vi) If the Commission finds that both existing zoning classification and the zoning classification requested in the proposed amendment are inappropriate, the Commission shall make a finding on the appropriate zoning classification for the property.

STANDARDS FOR VARIATIONS

Case #: 2015-026

Address: 300 E. Madison & 227 N. 4th Street

(i) Can the property in question be economically used or yield a reasonable return, if permitted to be used only for the conditions allowed by the regulations?

The property contains a billboard in excess of 300 square feet as well as a surface parking lot. The petitioner proposes to develop the parking lot with a five story building with one story of commercial/retail space and four stories of apartments. The billboard has an existing lease that was part of the property acquisition that must stay with the property. As such, the property could not be developed without the billboard remaining.

- (ii) Is the plight of the owner due to unique circumstances? The billboard was in existence with the previous owner and is part of the property acquisition.
- (iii) Will the variation, if granted, alter the essential character of the locality, impair an adequate supply of light and air to adjacent property, increase the congestion of traffic, or diminish or impair property values in the locality?

There should be no negative impact as the billboard has been in place for a number of years with no adverse effects.

COMES NOW Petitioner, The Villas Downtown Springfield, LLC, and respectfully petitions the Council of the City of Springfield as follows:

1. The Petitioner has a contract to purchase 300 E Madison and 227 N 4th Street Springfield, Illinois, legally described as:

Old Town Plat L 3 B4, Old Town Plat L 2 W1/2 B4, Old Town Plat L2 E ½ B4, Old Town Plat L1 B4 situated in the County of Sangamon and State of Illinois; commonly known as 300 E Madison and 227 N 4th Street Springfield, Illinois and further identified as Index #14-27.0-355-001, 14-27.0-355-002, 14-27.0-355-003, 14-27.0-355-004.

2. Said property is located on East Madison and consists of Two Hundred Forty-Five and Twenty-five hundredths (245.25') feet frontage on East Madison Street by One Hundred Fifty-Seven (157') feet depth and running South from East Madison Street and being approximately Thirty-Eight Thousand Five Hundred Four (38,504) square feet of land.

- 3. The improvements (or structures) located on said property are a billboard sign and black top parking lot.
- 4. The subject real estate is currently classified in the B-2, General Business Service District.
- 5. The Petitioner, The Villas Downtown Springfield, desires to construct a five story building to include one story of commercial/retail space and four stories of market rate apartments.
- 6. The Petitioner, to be in compliance with the Zoning Ordinance respectfully petitions to reclassify the above mentioned property from B-2, General Business Service District, to S-3, Central Shopping District which will allow the Petitioner meet the needs of future commercial/retail tenants.
- 7. As stated above herein, Petitioner also requests a variance of Section 155.001 of the Zoning Ordinance to allow for more than one principal use on the Subject Real Estate. The definition of "principal use" under Section 155.001 reads:

Principal use. The predominant use of land or a structure designated by the owner as the primary or main use and to which any other use must be accessory.

Further, Section 155.300, Definitions, (a)(8), of the Zoning Ordinance states that:

Billboard. A type of freestanding sign that has greater than 300 square feet of sign areas determined by this chapter. Billboards constitute a separate and distinct use due to the size and prominence upon the landscape. A billboard is considered an "advertising sign".

Therefore, a variance is necessary to allow an additional principal use to accommodate a billboard currently onsite.

8. Such variance:

- A. Is necessary for Petitioner to realize reasonable return, as the billboard existed on the Subject Real Estate prior to Petitioner and a lease is in place.
- B. Will not alter the essential character of the area, impair light or air to adjacent property or new building, will not increase traffic congestion or diminish property values in the area. The billboard is discretely located on the extreme Northwest corner of the Subject Real Estate and up against railroad tracks bordering the Subject Real Estate to the West.

The property contains a retail strip mall and can continue to be utilized economically. To the extent that having a donation box at this location contributes to the public benefit, then the property would enhance the reasonable return. Appropriate signage on the POD and box easily identifies the donation area and separates it from the existing directional and advertising signage utilized by the strip mall tenants.

(ii) Is the plight of the owner due to unique circumstances?

- Count the donor under the respective hour. Log the weight, by type (soft goods, hard goods, books) onto the Daily Donation Log. Furniture and OLI (Other Large Items) are counted as "pieces" and logged as such on the Daily Donation Log.
- Due to the small size of the POD, we cannot accept large pieces of furniture. Offer the address of the nearest Savers store.

3. Store donations, by type, in the designated areas

- Small hard goods and books that are brought in loose should be boxed and stacked against the left wall (books are to be boxed and stacked separately from hard goods)
 For safety purposes, full boxes should not exceed 40 lbs. in weight.
- Bag any loose cloth. Stack all cloth against the back wall, two rows deep. Tie the
 ends of all bags so product doesn't fall out when handling.
- OLI and furniture are to be stacked along the right wall. Tape any loose remotes to the respective TV or stereo so they will not be lost.
- Do not open bags to sort donations by type. If they are mostly cloth, store them as cloth. If the are mostly hard goods, store them as hard goods.

Keep the POD looking organized throughout the day. It will make a difference in the donor's impression of how you handle their items.

- 1. As necessary, communicate need for POD to be emptied

- Never allow trucking to park at the opening of the POD. This space is reserved for donors.
- Use the gray tub to load product to be moved from the POD to the truck
- Use the hand truck to move boxes
- Use proper lifting techniques to avoid injury
- 3. Weigh and record all shipments on the ADS Transfer Delivery Report
- Load all furniture and record on the report as pieces
- Load all OLI and record on the report as pieces
- Load all hard goods and record weight for each tub (or hand truck load) in pounds
- Load all books and record weight for each tub (or hand truck load) in pounds
- Load all cloth and record weight for each tub in pounds
- Remember to subtract the weight of the tub or hand truck from each load
- Keep the original (white copy) of the ADS Transfer Delivery Report on file at the ADS.
 Give the yellow and pink copies to the driver for their records and the store's records

Note: Under no circumstances is any product to be taken out of the POD except when loading onto the truck.

The trucking personnel are part of the Savers Team. Be helpful and friendly while working with them. Thank them for their assistance.

(i) Can the property in question be economically used or yield a reasonable return, if permitted to be used only for the conditions allowed by the regulations?

The purpose of the variance request is to place three wall signs on the side of the church that total approximately 576 square feet. To the extent that such wall signs increase attendance at the worship services resulting in a positive yield to the congregation, then the variance may be warranted. However, it is unsure as to the nature and location of the additional 474 square feet of signage being requested. More information needs to be provided to determine if the additional square footage is needed.

<u>AMENDED</u>: Testimony was provided to clarify that all signage on the property would total less than the requested 1,050 square feet.

(ii) Is the plight of the owner due to unique circumstances?

The church is located on a large lot with relatively large setbacks in the R-1 zoning district. The R-1 district presumes a majority of the territory will be occupied by single-family residences, which are more likely to be grouped more closely together and be on lower velocity public streets than the church on the subject property. This increased density leads to a heightened perception of large signs for residences that is not necessarily apparent when the primary structure is a large church building, on a large lot, that is spaced relatively far back from the public street.

(iii) Will the variation, if granted, alter the essential character of the locality, impair an adequate supply of light and air to adjacent property, increase the congestion of traffic, or diminish or impair property values in the locality?

It appears that the 576 square feet of signage will not have a negative impact on the immediate area. It is unknown where the additional 474 square feet of signage will be located or if it will have a negative impact.

<u>AMENDED</u>: Testimony was provided that that the signage on the property would total less than the requested 1,050 square feet. Staff finds that the increased square footage of signage would not have a negative impact on the immediate area due to the location of the subject property.

(i) Can the property in question be economically used or yield a reasonable return, if permitted to be used only for the conditions allowed by the regulations?

The variance request would allow the petitioner to construct a sign in excess of the twenty-two (22) square feet allowed by code. Page 1 of the petition indicates a sign of thirty-two (32) square feet. However, the sign also includes a graphic display adjacent to the sign text. Page 2 of the petition indicates a sign of approximately three (3) by fifteen (15) feet, or forty-five (45) square feet. Testimony should be obtained to determine how much signage in the 32-45 square feet range the petitioner intends to use. In either case, the proposed sign will be smaller than the original awning, which was eighty-five (85) square feet according to Page 2 of the petition. Thus, granting the variance would appear to be less intense than the previous awning sign, allowing the property in question to yield a reasonable return.

(ii) Is the plight of the owner due to unique circumstances?

The subject property is located along a low speed, one-way street with heavy vehicular and pedestrian traffic. While the signage would not be noticeable along a higher-speed more heavily vehicular traffic arterial roadway such as Wabash or Veterans, in downtown, the requested signage could be noticeable. While this does help yield a reasonable return on the property, it is not a unique circumstance to the buildings along this block of South Sixth, between Adams and Monroe.

(iii) Will the variation, if granted, alter the essential character of the locality, impair an adequate supply of light and air to adjacent property, increase the congestion of traffic, or diminish or impair property values in the locality?

- (ii) Is the plight of the owner due to unique circumstances?

 The petition indicates that the variance is requested due to tightened lending requirements by Fannie Mae. There are several examples throughout Springfield where variances were granted to allow condominium to zero lot line duplex splits due to the tighter lending regulatory environment.
- (iii) Will the variation, if granted, alter the essential character of the locality, impair an adequate supply of light and air to adjacent property, increase the congestion of traffic, or diminish or impair property values in the locality?

FINDINGS OF FACT

Case #: 2015-036

Address: 1120 E. Capitol Avenue & 411 & 427 S. 12th Street

(i) Existing uses of property within the general area of the property in question.

North: School. South: Vacant building. East: Duplex and Single-family residence. West: Graphics/printing services. Southwest: Auto parts repair.

(ii) The zoning classification of property within the general area of the property in question.

North and south: R-3b. East: R-2 and R-3b. West: I-1. Southwest: B-2.

(iii) The suitability of the property in question to the uses permitted under the existing zoning classification.

The property contains a large commercial building that can be used for various uses. However, given the neighborhood, it is unlikely that I-1 uses would be appropriate for the area.

(iv) The trend of development, if any, in the general area of the property in question, including changes, if any, which have taken place since the day the property in question was placed in its present zoning classification.

The area has maintained its residential nature to the east with the school as the anchor to the north. Properties to the west that front on 11th Street have developed with commercial uses.

(v) The relationship of the uses allowed under the proposed zoning classification to the Official City Plan.

The City Plan indicates that efforts should be made maintain a stable neighborhood in this area. The property contains a commercial structure that is vacant. Redevelopment of the property as a church community center would contribute to a stable neighborhood.

(vi) If the Commission finds that both existing zoning classification and the zoning classification requested in the proposed amendment are inappropriate, the Commission shall make a finding on the appropriate zoning classification for the property.

The existing I-1 zoning is not compatible with the other less intense uses in the immediate area. However, the property contains a commercial structure which is somewhat difficult to redevelop. While the requested R-3b zoning permits some uses that would be compatible with the area, the R-3b zoning also permits several uses that would not be compatible with the area, i.e. boarding or lodging houses, apartment hotels, multiple-residential units. As such, staff finds that R-2 zoning would be most appropriate for the subject property.

(i) Can the property in question be economically used or yield a reasonable return, if permitted to be used only for the conditions allowed by the regulations?

The property contains a commercial structure that was built many years ago. As such, there are limitations on redevelopment due to the lack of existing setbacks. It is likely that any redevelopment of the property to uses more compatible with the area would require variances in order to yield a reasonable return.

- (ii) Is the plight of the owner due to unique circumstances?

 The property contains an existing building that was developed many years ago in the I-1 zoning district. To develop the property with uses more compatible with the area, variances are required.
- (iii) Will the variation, if granted, alter the essential character of the locality, impair an adequate supply of light and air to adjacent property, increase the congestion of traffic, or diminish or impair property values in the locality?

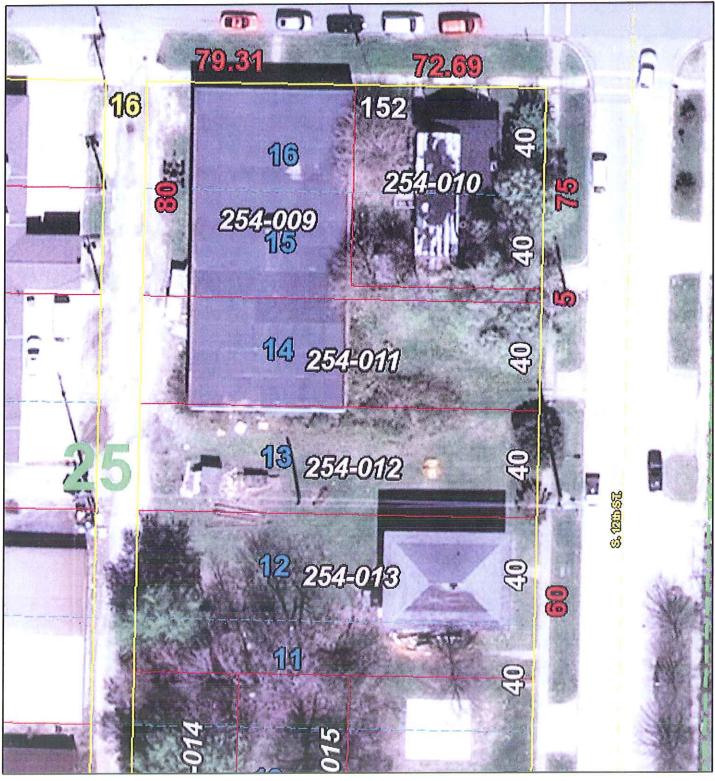

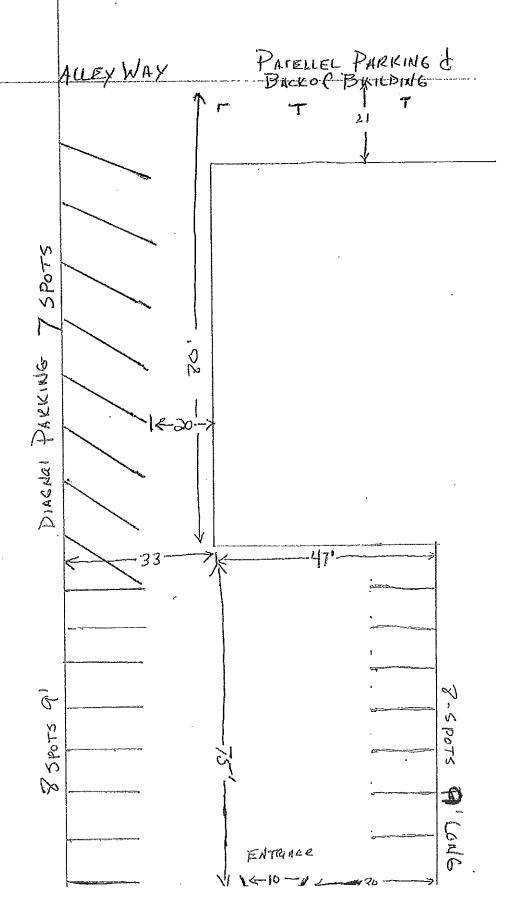
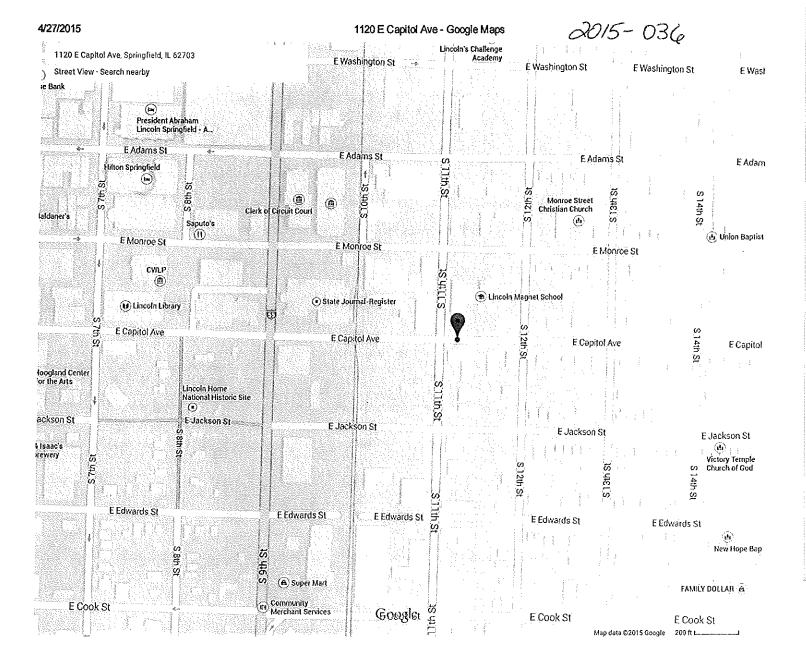

A possible option that will be looked at during the design stage of this project will be adding parallel parking on the west side of the existing building (120feet length). There is sixteen (16) feet of property between the building and the alley of which we would have a five (5) feet paved walkway leaving eleven (11) feet of width. This I believe would allow for the required eight (8) feet wide by twenty-five (25) length of space needed for parallel parking. We would have signage and markings that clearly would define one set direction of traffic flow. If this was granted it would allow for an additional 3-4 parking spaces with a 20feet to 45feet of setback from the front of the building.

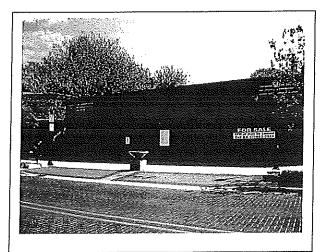

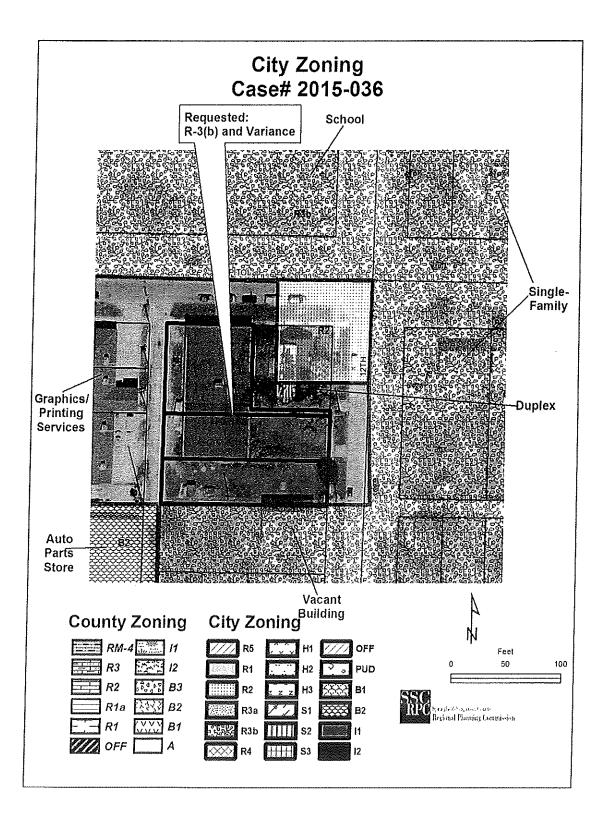

PLANNING COMMISSION STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

Recommend denial of the requested R-3b zoning. The existing I-1 zoning is not compatible with the other less intense uses in the immediate area. However, the property contains a commercial structure which is somewhat difficult to redevelop. While the requested R-3b zoning permits some uses that would be compatible with the area, the R-3b zoning also permits several uses that would not be compatible with the area, i.e. boarding or lodging houses, apartment hotels, and multiple-residential units. In the alternative, staff recommends that R-2 zoning would be most appropriate for the subject property. Recommend approval of the requested variances. I am writing today on behalf of Knox Knolls Free Methodist Church located at 2251 W. Monroe Street. Regarding the petition for a Conditional Permitted Use pursuant to section 155.031 (c) (7), we affirm the prohibition against the sale of alcohol, "within 100 feet of the nearest residential zoning lot, church park, school, community facility or commercial daycare." This is a wise policy, in place to guard neighborhoods and residential areas from the damaging effects of the misuse of alcohol. The restriction is in place to guard public safety and the common good.

We affirm that the restaurant requesting a variance "for the sale of alcohol by the drink," is in no way seeking to act against neighborhood safety or the public good. We applaud the desire to start a business and bring jobs to the neighborhood. It is our understanding that if a variance is approved it will include the following stipulations:

- a reasonable closing time consistent with the close proximity to a residential area;
- at least 60% of sales will come from the sale of food;

- the restaurant is not a bar serving hard liquor or mixed drinks;

1. Petitioner is the record owner of the Subject Real Estate.

- 2. The Subject Real Estate has dimensions of approximately 40 feet by 150 feet, for a total of approximately 6,000 square feet. It has approximately 40 feet of frontage on the West side of North Ninth Street.
- 3. The Subject Real Estate is zoned B-1. It is improved with a single family residence that, according to the records of the Capital Township Assessor, was constructed in 1860. The property has over the years been used as a single family residence and thus has been classified as a nonconforming use.
- 4. The residential structure on the Subject Real Estate had been the long time residence of Michael Noonan's grandparents. The residence is now vacant and is need of extensive repairs. Petitioner desires to commence repairs on the home so that it may again be used as a single family residence by the Noonan family. Section 155.157 of the Zoning Ordinance, however, provides that: "If a nonconforming use discontinues active continuous operations for a period of six (6) months, the building or the land where such nonconforming use existed shall be occupied and used only for a conforming use."
- 5. The Subject Real Estate has not been used for a single family residence for several years, and it has been registered with the City as an abandoned building. A single family residence is not a permitted use in the B-1 zoning district. The property to the immediate South of the Subject Real Estate is used as a single family residence. The properties along the West side of North Ninth Street to the North of the Subject Real Estate are used for residential purposes.
- 6. The Subject Real Estate is too small for business use, and the structure on the property is a single family residence. Petitioner intends to renovate the single family residence to enable it to again be used for residential purposes by the Noonan family. In order to use said property for a single family purpose, Petitioner seeks a variance of Section 157.157 of the Zoning Ordinance to allow the property to continue to be used as an allowed nonconforming single family residential use in a B-1 zoning district. Petitioner is prepared to undertake a significant expenditure to renovate the residential structure and to bring the residence into conformity with the Springfield Building Code. Petitioner, however, will not be allowed by the City to obtain a building permit until and unless Petitioner obtains the variance sought herein.

- 7. In regard to the variance requested herein:
- (a) The Subject Real Estate cannot be economically used or cannot yield a reasonable return if permitted to be used only for conditions allowed by the regulations. As stated hereinabove, the property is located on a small lot and the properties to the North and South of the Subject Real Estate are used for single family residential purposes. Relative thereto, if the house on the Subject Real Estate is demolished, it is very unlikely that anyone would purchase the Subject Real Estate to use the same for business use. Unless the residential structure on the Subject Real Estate is renovated, it will need to be demolished and the Subject Real Estate will become a vacant lot with little value.
- (b) The plight of Petitioner is due to unique circumstances. The size of the lot, the fact that there are single family uses to the North and South, and the fact that the Subject Real Estate is currently improved with the nonconforming single family residence demonstrate that the plight of Petitioner is due to unique circumstances.
- (c) The variance requested will not alter the essential character of the locality, impair an adequate supply of light and air to adjacent properties, increase congestion of traffic or diminish or impair property values in the locality. The granting of this variance will allow the improvement of a vacant residential building which will be an aesthetic improvement to the neighborhood. Also, the building in question was apparently built in 1860. Thus, the variance will preserve a very old building which, once improved, will complement existing residences located in the immediate neighborhood along the West side of North Ninth Street.

WHEREFORE, Petitioner prays that the Springfield Planning and Zoning Commission of the City of Springfield, Illinois recommend approval of a variance of Section 155.157 of the Zoning Ordinance to allow the Petitioner to continue to use the residential structure on the property as a nonconforming single family residence in the B-1 zoning district in which the property is situated.

- Petitioner, David P. Barkus, is a contract purchaser of the Subject Property which 1. is owned of record by Lincoln Land Development Co., LWS Enterprises, Ltd. and by United Community Bank, as Trustee of Trust No. 404-030.
- The Subject Property was originally operated as part of the Landmark Ford automobile sales and service business. Said automobile business relocated a number of years ago. The Subject Property is improved with two buildings. The building on the South portion

of the Property is the principal building and contains approximately 13,400 square feet. The building on the North end of the Subject Property contains approximately 6,860 square feet. 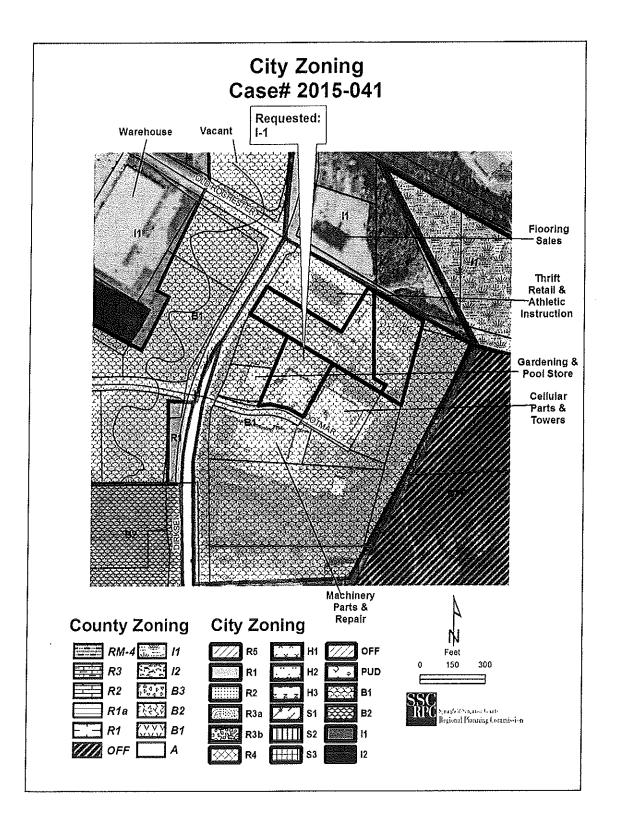
