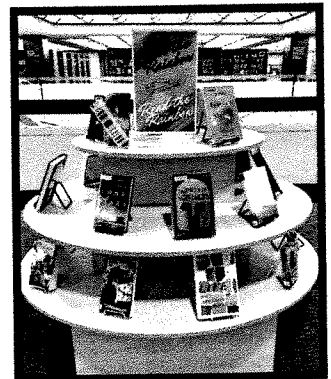

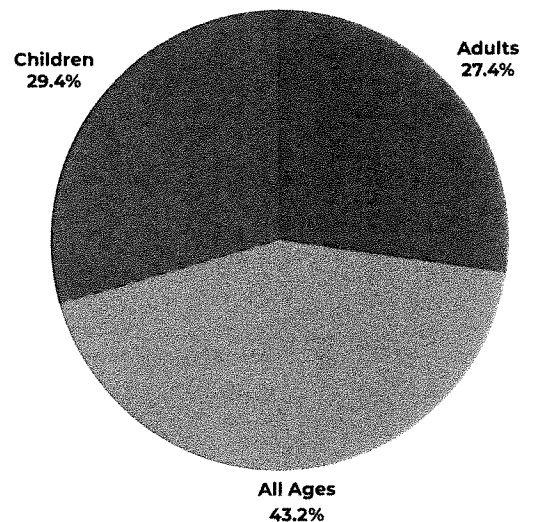
# Programming

### Programs by Topic

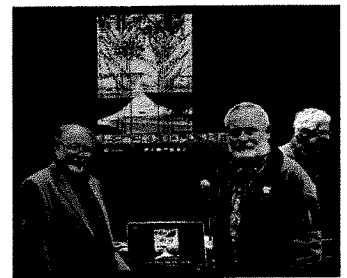


### Programs by Age Group

Community groups held 572 meetings in the library's public meeting rooms.

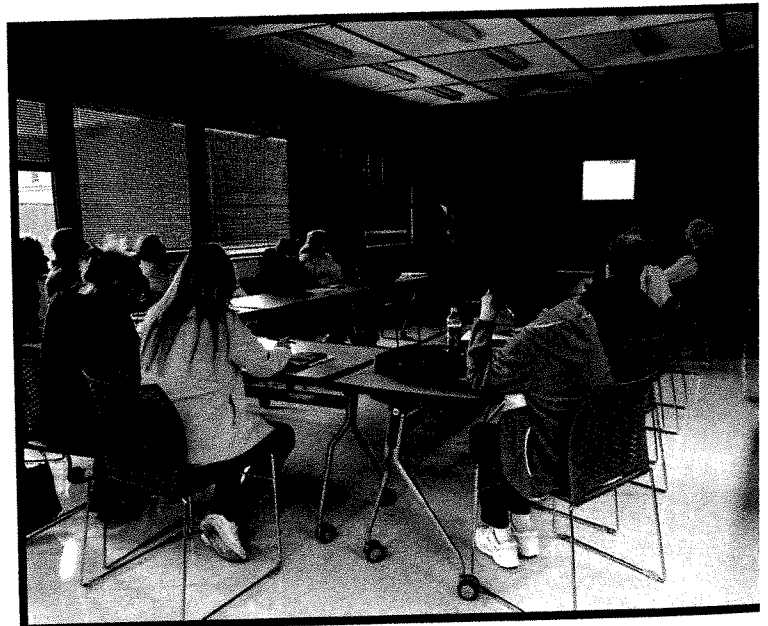
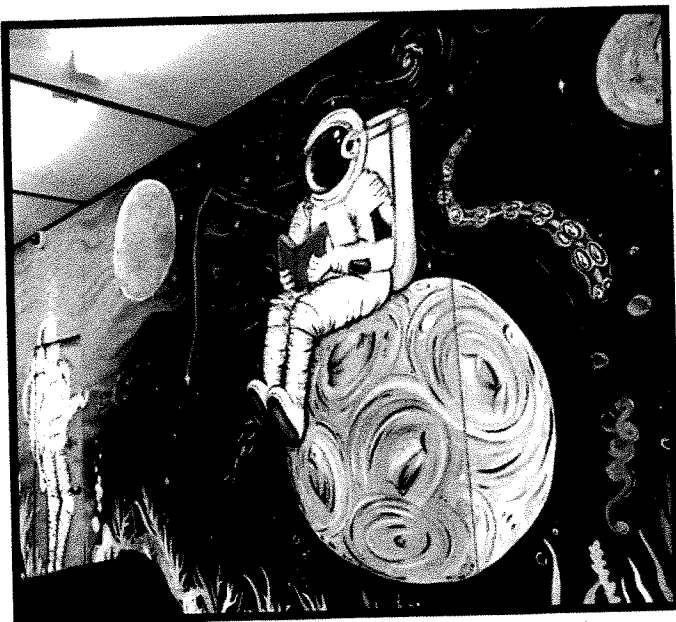

**Hosted 58 pop-up libraries**

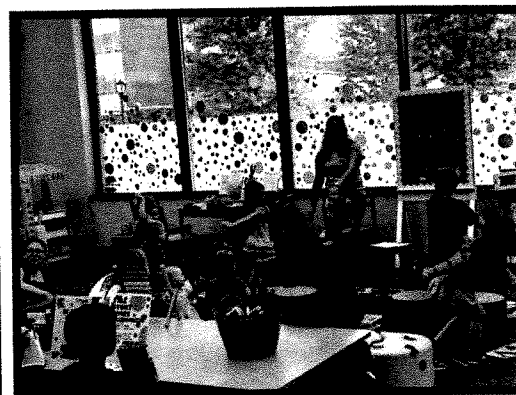


The Lincoln Library Outreach Department reached a total of 3,250 individuals at off-site events.

**550 Summer Reading Program participants read 2,300 books**

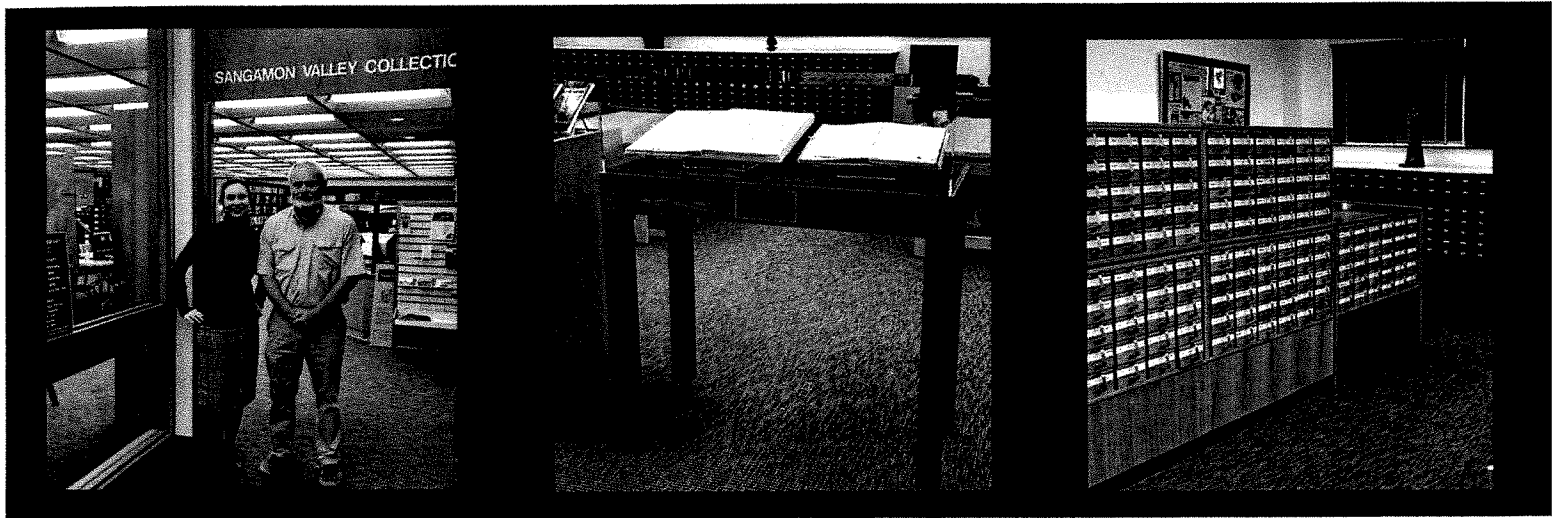
**994 children participated in Lincoln Library Storytimes**

## SVC

2023 was an exciting and productive year for Lincoln Library's Sangamon Valley Collection.

- Acquired Lanphier High School's student newspapers from the 1940s - 2020s.

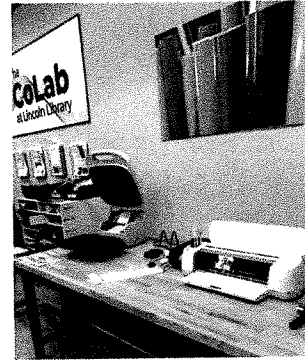
### Student Visits

## 2023 BY THE NUMBERS

### CoLab

Work on the CoLab began in spring of 2023 with acquisition of a 3D printer, sewing and embroidery machines, Cricuts and other creation materials. Classes began in the summer of 2023.



### Library of Things



There were 296 checkouts from the Library of Things collection in 2023, a 153% increase from 2022.

The most popular items were power washers, karaoke machines, and yard games.

### Graphic Novels

Due to the growing popularity of Graphic Novels, this collection was relocated to a larger and more visible space in the library. This resulted in a 30% increase in checkouts in 2023.
